20	ASSIGNMENT OF EXECUTIVE STIPULATION
21	DEPARTMENT JOB CLASSIFICATIONS TO BARGAINING UNITS

23	WHEREAS, on July 30, 2019, and pursuant to Section 53(1) of Senate Bill 135 from
24	the 80th (2019) legislative session of the State of Nevada ("SB 135"), the Executive
25	Department of the State of Nevada ("the State") submitted a report ("the Report") containing
26	its recommendation as to which of its job classifications should be assigned to each of the
27	eleven bargaining units contained in Section 29 of SB 135; and
28	

WHEREAS, in the Report the State recommended that the classifications of Social Worker 1, Social Worker 2, and Social Worker 3 (collectively "Social Worker classifications") be placed in Bargaining Unit E; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 53(2) of SB 135, any labor organization could file an objection to the recommendations contained within the Report with the Government Employee Management Relations Board ("the Board"); and

WHEREAS, the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, Local 4041 ("AFSCME") objected to the recommended placement of the Social Worker classifications into Bargaining Unit E arguing that the Social Worker classifications should instead be placed in Bargaining Unit D; and

WHEREAS, on September 10, 2019, the State and AFSCME ("the Parties") submitted a Stipulation and Order to voluntarily resolve the objection by agreeing that the Social Worker classifications should be moved from Bargaining Unit E to Bargaining Unit D; and

WHEREAS, on September 18, 2019, the Board filed a Notice of Entry of Order for Case No. 2019-017, which ordered that the Social Worker classifications be placed in Bargaining Unit D; and

WHEREAS, on January 22, 2020, AFSCME gained recognition as the exclusive bargaining representative of Bargaining Unit E; and

WHEREAS, on July 1, 2021, the Parties entered into a Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") for bargaining Unit E that erroneously included the Social Worker classifications; and

WHEREAS, the State employees in the Social Worker classifications have received the benefits and protections under the AFSCME CBA for over four years; and

WHEREAS, no bargaining representative has gained recognition of Bargaining Unit D; and

WHEREAS, during its August 18, 2025, meeting the Board discussed the erroneous placement of the Social Worker classifications into Bargaining Unit E and requested that the

1 Parties submit a stipulation of their desired placement of the Social Worker classifications 2 within a bargaining unit; and 3 NOW, THEREFORE, the State and AFSCME hereby agree and stipulate as follows: 1. The job classifications of Social Worker 1, Social Worker 2, and Social Worker 3 4 5 should remain in Bargaining Unit E. 2. Upon the recognition and approval of an exclusive representative for Bargaining 6 7 Unit D, the Parties shall have sixty (60) days to discuss whether the Social Worker 1, Social Worker 2, and Social Worker 3 job classifications should be placed in 8 Bargaining Unit D and submit a status report to the Board. 9 3.
